#### The program

The Young Leaders Program aims to help the next generation of leaders achieve their potential. It is managed by the International Leaders Program team at the University's Office of Global Engagement.

The **Australian Health Sector and Pharmaceutical Industry** Program is a customised non-award short course. It draws on the knowledge of experts from the University of Sydney and the health care industry to provide students with a wide ranging perspective. This interdisciplinary course is designed to help students develop an understanding of the latest development, trends and innovations – as well as the challenges – in the worldwide health care industry.

The program consists of lectures, seminars, group work, educational trips and company visits. In addition, students will learn about Australian culture, enhance their intercultural awareness and develop communication and teamwork skills throughout the program.

## Program dates

31 July to 18 August 2018

- 31 July: arrive in Sydney
- 01 August: program starts
- 17 August: program ends
- 18 August: departure

## Participants

University students with a strong interest in healthcare at all levels of study are welcome to apply. In 2017, we received students studying biomedical engineering, life sciences, medicine and pharmacy.

The program will be taught entirely in English, therefore an adequate English language ability including listening and speaking is essential.

Participants will have the opportunity to study alongside students from other leading universities as well as to meet students at the University of Sydney.

## Fee

The program fee of **AUD4,280** per student covers:

- tuition fee
- field trips
- Welcome and Closing ceremony
- twin or triple shared accommodation (room only) from 31 July to 18 August in a hotel\* within walking distance of the University
- group airport pick-up on 31 July and transfer on 18 August\*
- Opal card for public transport in Sydney
- Certificate of Attendance and Assessment Report upon successful completion

\* College accommodation is not available during university term time.

\* Students who are not able to meet the group pick-up and transfer times will need to make their own travel arrangements. Travel instructions will be provided.
